
THE SCULPTURE COLLECTION AT THE ARBORETUM

They boast spectacular spring foliage, summer shade, stunning fall colors, and graceful silhouettes and bark color in winter. The Pacific Northwest offers perfect growing conditions for these beautiful trees.

BACKYARD GARDEN

Explore the landscape features of a typical Northwest home garden. Creative plant design is used for year-round color, texture, scent, flowers and foliage.

HORIZONTAL ROCK GARDEN

Miniature specimens including conifers, shrubs, perennials, grasses and groundcovers thrive in the cracks and crevices of beautiful huckleberry basalt stones. The stones surround Roundness of the Horizon - The Fossil, an installation by Katzutaka Uchida. Using a combination of foliage, texture, form and color, the plantings offer year-round interest.
